Dear Majority Leader Reid:

As representatives of American maritime labor, U.S. ship owners and operators, and U.S. shipyards, we are writing to ask that you include the American Shipping Reinvestment Act ("ASRA"), S. 1610, in the jobs package currently under consideration. The legislation was introduced by Sen. Maria Cantwell in August 2009, and has bipartisan support by Sens. Patty Murray, Daniel K. Inouye, John Rockefeller IV, Mary Landrieu, David Vitter, Thad Cochran, and George LeMieux.

ASRA would encourage shipping companies to reinvest foreign income generated between the years 1975 and 1986 into the U.S. shipping industry. As a result, ASRA would spur U.S. job growth by creating a broad and diverse range of well-paying employment opportunities for American workers – in shipyards building and repairing U.S.-flag vessels, in licensed and unlicensed positions aboard the vessels, and in the shoreside offices supporting vessel operations. The bill also includes a job protection provision. In order to preserve the tax benefits enacted by ASRA, companies must, at a minimum, maintain their current employment levels.

Under a 1970s tax provision, U.S. shipping companies must maintain investments made between 1975 and 1986 in qualified foreign shipping assets. Because any net decrease in these investments results in an immediate tax penalty, this provision has stranded significant capital of U.S. shipping companies in foreign assets. ASRA would repeal this outdated provision, allowing U.S. shipping companies a one-time opportunity to reinvest those prior year foreign source earnings at a reduced tax rate.

Recent studies have demonstrated the tremendous economic impacts of stimulating investments in the U.S. maritime sector. For example, a 2002 study found that 3.7 jobs were created elsewhere in the economy for every job created in a shippard building U.S.-flag vessels. Another study found the construction of tankers in a U.S. shippard would increase average annual employment in the region where the shippard was located by 1,217 jobs and nationally by 2,902 jobs during the period of construction.

Enactment of ASRA will lead to more U.S.-flag ships and more American jobs, at little or no cost to the U.S. government. We respectfully urge you to enact this important measure.
